4. FIRST AID MEASURES

First Aid Procedures:

Inhalation:	Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Call a physician if symptoms occur.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling:
